

The 14 regional airports concession in numbers

On December 14, 2015, Fraport Greece signed contracts with the Hellenic Republic Asset Development Fund (HRADF) and the Greek State for the 40-year concessions to operate, manage, develop and maintain 14 regional airports in Greece. At the time of the project closing, the full upfront concession fee of €1.234 billion will be paid by Fraport Greece. Along with the upfront concession payment, an annual fixed concession fee of initially €22.9 million and a variable annual concession fee of an average 28.5 percent of the operational profit will be paid. In addition, Fraport Greece will invest a total of €330 million in airport infrastructure until 2020.
